

Honors Course Equivalencies (new core)

Should a student enrolled in the honors program decide to withdraw from the program, the following guidelines have been established for converting Honors courses to core requirement equivalents. Each honors course is four credits. Therefore, one honors course may be applied to multiple core requirements (three credits each) depending on length of time in the honors program.

For advising purposes, a student should first meet with their Honors advisor and then with their academic advisor to determine which core requirements will apply. The advisor may check courses on this form and submit to the Advising Office. This form will then be forwarded to the Registrar's Office for record keeping.

Hon 201	History Core or THE 110 Word of God: Scripture and Tradition
Hon 202	ENG 210 Epic and the Person (Literature) or ENG 211 Lyric and Dramatic Voices (Literature) or History Core
Hon 301	History Core or PHL 113 Philosophy of the Human Person or PHL 211 Metaphysics
Hon 302	American Founding Principles or ECO 201 Macroeconomics or Social Science
Hon 401	American Founding Principles or PHL 113 Philosophy of the Human Person or PHL 211 Metaphysics or PHL 212 Foundations of Ethics or Social Science
Hon 402	PHL 211 Metaphysics or Social Science
32 honors credits =	10 core classes (three credits each) plus 2 elective credit hours.

Honors courses satisfy the following core curriculum when the program is completed in its entirety: American Founding Principles, Economics, History, Literature (ENG 210 and 211), Philosophy (113, 211, and 212), Social Science, and Theology 110.

Honors courses do not cover the following core requirements: Catholic Traditions in Fine Arts, Natural Sciences, THE 101 Foundations of Catholicism and THE 115 Christian Moral Principles.
